Bay's marine life on show

Have you heard of the snubfin dolphin? If not, you're probably not alone - this enigmatic creature was only identified as a separate species in 2005.

Broome's Roebuck Bay is home to one of the largest populations of snubfin dolphins in Australia.

The dolphins are just one of many species that inhabit the waters, beaches and mudflats of Roebuck Bay. This globally renowned marine environment includes turtles, dugongs, manta rays, migratory shorebirds, mangroves and sea grasses.

The bay's remarkable wildlife is the focus of a new range of eco

Broome Whale Watching and Sentosa Charters' owner Cameron Birch says snubfin dolphins have been spotted on

each day of the company's recently launched eco tours.

"They've been swimming up to the boat and being very interactive," he said. Absolute Ocean Charters' new

eco sunset cruise is hosted by a marine biologist, who provides insight into both the marine wildlife and sights along the coastline.

Owner Kelly Woodley said the tours highlighted Broome's beauty and biodiversity.

The Broome Visitor Centre has helped get the new tours up and running.

Visitor centre general manager Nick Linton said it was exciting to have a new tourism product focused on Roebuck Bay that is available to visitors throughout the year.

The new eco tours complement existing Roebuck Bay tours, such

as Broome Adventure Company's turtle kayak tours, Kimberley Kayak Fishing, and Broome Hovercraft, which offers a unique way see the bay and its dinosaur footprints.

The Broome Bird Observatory, nested on the shore of the bay, is another must-see for wildlife

The bay will soon be protected through the proposed Yawuru Nagulagun/Roebuck Bay Marine Park, which will be jointly managed by Yawuru and the Department of Parks and Wildlife.

Mr Birch said the

establishment of the marine park was "fantastic" and would put Roebuck Bay on the map.

Research into snubfin dolphins in Roebuck Bay is being led by Yawuru and WWF-Australia. Tour operators have flagged the potential to collaborate on research by logging sightings of the dolphins.




