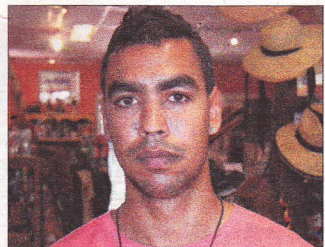
I don't think they should have to shoot him. He will move on sooner or later.
