SHIRE of Broome rangers have served notices on people believed to be camping illegally on the Demco foreshore. The rangers issued the notices under instruction from the Department of Regional Development and Lands.

Shire chief executive Kenn Donohoe said its emergency ranger and beach services manager and three rangers were escorted by police to the area to issue the notices under section 270 of the Lands Administration Act WA.

"These notices advise that the area of land in question is being occupied illegally and the structures erected to shel-

ter those illegally occupying the area are in fact unauthorised structures," he said.

"The notice directs the owners or occupiers of the land to remove the structures, their contents and any materials, objects and fixtures around the unauthorised structures."

In accordance with the Act, the notices give until March 6 for the structures and other items to be removed, before they become the property of the Crown.

A male Demco resident, who did not wish to be named, said residents had waited a long

time for a response to camping at the locality.

He said Demco residents had held meetings to discuss the issue, with a number of complaints made to the Shire over a three-year period.

The resident said the move by the Shire was the “best thing” he had seen yet and was confident it would effectively move campers away from the Demco area.

He said he found it amazing that the local government had continually sent off people who camped in the Cable Beach carpark but had not earlier moved on people from the Demco area who did not have toilets.

The man said he believed the area was like a tip.
