WANT TO BE A SHARK RESEARCHER?

Whale sharks are known from Ningaloo, but reports show they are also found all along the WA coast, from Albany to Broome - and maybe beyond!

From March until May 2013, not-for-profit whale shark conservation group, ECOCEAN, is travelling along the WA coast in the hope to find other whale shark hot spots.

ECOCEAN will be holding a free community information evening in every town we visit to record previous whale shark sightings people may have seen and to introduce the photo-identification program we use to monitor whale sharks at Ningaloo and around the world.

Come along and learn how you can become a 'citizen scientist' and help ECOCEAN solve the mystery surrounding the world's biggest fish!
